



What is Middle States?

Nationally recognized accreditation process dedicated to educational excellence and improvement through peer evaluation of public and private universities and colleges.

Reaccreditation is required every eight years. We are currently preparing for a site visit from our peer evaluators in spring 2026, and an integral part of this process is the development of a comprehensive self-study examining all aspects of the institution.

UMBC's Self-Study

The purpose is to engage the institution in a collaborative and inclusive process of self-reflection. Our Self-Study should produce a report that not only meets the MSCHE expectations for each of the seven Standards of Accreditation, but results in broad institutional self-knowledge of our mission, goals, challenges and opportunities, reaffirming our commitment to continuous improvement.

Our Self-Study is a campus-wide initiative, promoting diverse reflection and dialogue on UMBC's priorities. It is conducted in concert with ongoing institutional strategic planning, so that the two processes synergistically contribute to both a thoughtful Self-Study and a forward-thinking, achievable strategic plan for UMBC's future.



- UMBC's BOLD Conversations




Student Success

Spring 2025: Where we are in the process now

- Self-Study Steering Committee will host an online feedback session, inviting further reflection and suggestions for continuous improvement (Wednesday, April 23, 12-1 p.m.)



Looking Ahead


- Summer 2025: Core team will fold in community suggestions and continue to gather evidence for our evidence inventory.
- Early September 2025: Institution-wide sharing and feedback for the full Self-Study Report draft.
- September 2025: UMBC will submit the Self-Study to the Evaluation Team Chair.
- October 2025: Evaluation Team Chair preliminary visit**
- March/April 2026: (Date TBD): Evaluation Team 3 day visit**

** UMBC leaders must be on campus during those days and available for questions or meetings as requested by the Evaluation Team.
