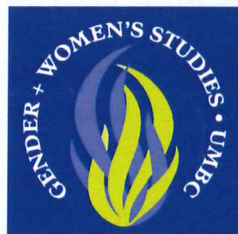

During her high school years, she became involved in efforts to shed light on the social injustices faced by undocumented immigrants in the U.S. She has gained national recognition for her courageous advocacy of the DREAM Act and passage of comprehensive immigration reform. She currently serves as the Program Director of The Dream US, a national organization that provides higher education fellowships to undocumented immigrants.
