As Attorney General for Maryland, Brian E. Frosh has joined multiple states in lawsuits challenging actions by the Trump Administration including: the immigration executive order, the 2020 census question on citizenship, declaration of a national emergency at the border, protecting the Affordable Care Act, and the emoluments clauses of the U.S. Constitution.

Attorney General Frosh will discuss the legal and political issues surrounding Maryland's involvement in these cases.

Attorney General Frosh was elected to the office in 2014. Prior to his current office, he served in the Maryland General Assembly for 28 years, including 12 years as chairman of the Senate Judicial Proceedings Committee. He had also been an attorney in private practice since 1976. Raised in Montgomery County, Attorney General Frosh graduated from Walter Johnson High School in Bethesda, earned a B.A. from Wesleyan University and received his law degree from the Columbia University School of Law.
