

The MS in Epidemiology of Infectious Diseases is a oneyear program in epidemiological methods and analysis of infectious diseases.

The **quantitative specialization** is for individuals who plan to pursue mentored research or doctoral studies. Graduates will be well-suited for careers in data analysis at state or national government agencies, or international health organizations, academia, NGOs or in industry.

The **clinical specialization** is a one-year program tailored to clinicians seeking formal research training in methods of infectious diseases epidemiology. Students will learn to conduct population-level research on communicable diseases and work with clinical researchers for formal training. Program graduates will be able to design observational and/or experimental research studies on the relationship between host, microbial or environmental factors on the occurrence or control of infectious diseases.

New Haven, Connecticut is located on Long Island Sound and offers a rich quality of life, combining the atmosphere of New England with vibrant culture and nightlife. It is close to Boston and New York City.

General GRE test scores (Institution code 3987) or MCAT scores are required. Students whose native language is not English must take the TOEFL examination. Waiver of the TOEFL is allowed for applicants who have received or will receive an undergraduate degree from a college or university where English is the primary language of instruction, and have studied in residence at that undergraduate institution for at least three years.
