January 8 – 12, 2024

STRiVE is a five-day, off-campus program that inspires and supports students in becoming more effective leaders in their communities. STRiVE participants develop friendships; discover their strengths and values; learn how to work more effectively in groups; envision how they can make a difference at UMBC; engage issues relating to identity, privilege, and systemic oppression; and tackle challenges that are common in leadership and social change. As a result of their STRiVE experiences, past participants have become deeply involved in campus organizations and initiatives, and have taken on critical leadership roles and made phenomenal contributions at UMBC and beyond.





Alternative Spring Break (ASB) is a five-day learning experience in which participants explore the systemic and human dimensions of complex social issues in Baltimore. What does it take to address deep, structural issues that have real impacts on people's lives? Participants build connections with local leaders, organizations, and policy makers and develop a sophisticated understanding of the resources and challenges that present themselves in the work it takes to make a better world. The program helps participants identify pathways to long-term community engagement.
