#### HCST 100: The Human Context of Science and Technology

Students will have the opportunity to consider the role of human values in the pursuit of the sciences and in the invention and employment of various technologies. #### HCST 499 / PUBL 398 / HIST 494: Public Health in Historical, Philosophical, and Social Context

We begin with an introduction to the field paying special attention to the epistemological, ethical, and legal dimensions of these issues. As we progress into our historical survey we will focus on cultural and social determinants of these issues, how they correspond to policy and practice in the present, and what, if anything, we might do to create change.
