







- How much money do you need to live a happy life?

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
How much money do you need to be happy?

- Do you have the ability/knowledge/experience/foresight to switch to a new career whenever necessary?

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

 - 4. Communication and Network Security (Designing and Protecting Network Security)

- 5. Identity and Access Management (Controlling Access and Managing Identity)
- 6. Security Assessment and Testing (Designing, Performing, and Analyzing Security Testing)
- 7. Security Operations (Foundational Concepts, Investigations, Incident Management, Disaster Recovery)
- 8. Software Development Security (Understanding, Applying, and Enforcing Software Security)

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
What do employers want? 1/2

 - Not fitting in with the corporate culture.

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

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
