# **Graduate Student Association**

- GSA is excited that a recent survey of graduate students yielded a 20 percent response rate.
- GSA is pursuing mandatory mentor/mentee agreements; however, a recent meeting with graduate program directors did not yield much support.
- Graduate students have expressed a need for work-from-home equipment, such as a desk or chair. Lisa has offered to help the GSA explore potential funding options for these resources.
- GSA is seeking housing alternatives for international students due to COVID-19 and the need for an initial guarantine.

- Senior Associate Athletic Director Gary Wohlstetter shared renderings of the remodeled Retriever Activities Center and provided an overview of recreational activities that are available on YouTube at <u>UMBCRecTV</u>.
