   Damian Doyle is the interim CISO until we find a replacement for Mark Cather, who has
   left UMBC.
- Duo Rollout for Students discussion from SGA meeting and next steps (D. Doyle) Only a few students enrolled in DUO during the voluntary enrollment in August. Start with the newest students first or rollout by majors starting with the largest. SGA approved enrolling all students by end of the academic year.
- 4. Ransomware audit by USM (D. Doyle) It's focused on critical systems like Datawarehouse and Peoplesoft. Hackers have become more sophisticated. Often infect systems and then see that system to other groups. They also wait for some time until most backups have expired. It can take up to 4 ½ months until you know you are hacked. The challenge here is that your backups have expired. If you pay the ransom, your data is returned about 50% of the time. Immutable backups cant be altered in any way. Ensuring privileged admin accounts have additional protections and safeguards from compromise. Enhanced alerting for systems using active monitoring and logging software.
- Enterprise Risk Process for Cybersecurity (J. Suess)
   Begin setting up a sub-committee for Cybersecurity as part of the Enterprise Risk Process. It will meet a couple of times during the semester.
