

Genomics and Society Mentorship Program

Open to students interested in the bioethics of research, clinical care, and/or public health.

Genomics and Society Mentorship Program (GSMP) begins with a 10-week summer internship program. The GSMP is an opportunity for undergraduate students from diverse and underrepresented backgrounds to gain experience doing research centered on ethical, legal and social implications of genomics.

Faculty from the **Johns Hopkins Berman Institute of Bioethics** will mentor trainees on bioethics broadly, and in the context of their specific projects, enabling students to identify and analyze morally relevant issues in science, medicine, and public health. Students will continue their connection to the Program throughout the academic year (for a total of 15 months), co-lead the planning of an activity related to their interests in Genomics and Society at their home institution, and return to Hopkins for several days the following summer for additional training, mentorship, and connection with the next cohort of trainees.
