



Spring 2022 Campaign Fellowship!

What: The Team 46 Campaign Fellowship is an opportunity for interested students to acquire valuable campaign skills while also working to re-elect Senate President Bill Ferguson, Delegate Luke Clippinger, and Delegate Robbyn Lewis! The program will run from mid-January to June 28, 2022, with fellows working approximately eight hours a week. **A stipend, equivalent to \$15 an hour, will be provided for each fellow!**

During the program, fellows will sign up for a total of six hours of direct voter contact (canvassing, phonebanking, etc.) per week. Additionally, two hours of each week will be dedicated to professional development, where fellows will learn how to run an effective and progressive political campaign. Professional development topics include field, data management, political communications, digital advertising, fundraising, and political leadership.

Who: We are seeking high school, undergraduate, and graduate students who are interested in learning more about how campaigns function while also working to elect practical and progressive leaders in Baltimore! This is also an opportunity for students who are interested in working for the city, county, or state government following graduation. No prior political experience is required.

Virtual or in-person: While some components of this fellowship are virtual, most of the program will take place in-person in the 46th district.
