Rita Colwell, Ph.D. is a groundbreaking microbiologist and the first woman to lead the National Science Foundation, where she served as the director from 1998 to 2004. She is a distinguished professor at the University of Maryland, College Park and at Johns Hopkins University's Bloomberg School of Public Health.
