First Year Seminars (FYS)

Small group active learning experiences with a professor who is passionate about teaching a course with a unique topic such as conflict resolution, discussing classics, poverty amidst plenty & others. Additional support for the transition to UMBC.

Transfer Student Seminars (TRS)

Seminars offered with specific content courses (Computing OR Engineering OR Biology); provide transfer students with an opportunity to build on their academic skills & work habits, and learn about UMBC in the process

Introduction to an Honors University Seminars (IHU/"Y" sections)

One-credit sections offered with many introductory courses (e.g., MATH106Y, ANTH211Y, SOCY101Y, as well as some First-Year Seminars); strengthen the transition to UMBC by enhancing academic skills and work habits, and building connections
