Working Online Giving into your Site

FIRST, THE WHY: DESCRIBING YOUR NEED

Helping your potential donors – students, parents, alumni, faculty, staff and university friends – understand why they should support you is not difficult when you use simple, clear language to describe your needs. Before you start, consider these questions:

- What are your needs?
- How can financial support help you fill those needs? What might a gift of \$100 mean to your department or program? How about a gift of \$1,000 or more?
- What is the outcome of needs fulfilled, as it applies to students or UMBC in general? How does that outcome tie in to your mission or UMBC's mission?

Once you know the answers to these questions, it's easier to make a case for support. Here's an extremely simplified example of language you might use to start the process:

The [NAME OF DEPARTMENT] is grateful for the support of the UMBC community. Gifts to the [NAME OF DEPARTMENT] allow the department to [EXAMPLE/S], which allows students to [OUTCOME]. Community support strengthens our academic program and ensures that current and future students have the tools they need to make the most of their studies here.

NEXT, THE HOW: IMPORTANT LANGUAGE TO INCLUDE ON YOUR SITE

Now that you've described your need, it's time to give your supporters an easy, direct way of making a gift. Here is some boilerplate language that covers all the bases:

Donors most commonly make gifts online or by check. You can make a secure one-time or recurring gift by visiting the UMBC Giving site at http://www.umbc.edu/giving. Simply click on "Make a Gift" and write "EXACT NAME OF DEPARTMENT or FUND" in the "Other Designations" field. You will receive an immediate e-mail confirmation of your gift, followed by a thank you and receipt from UMBC within a few weeks, which you may use for tax purposes. Your full gift will go directly to the designation you choose.

Checks should be made payable to the UMBC Foundation and mailed along with a completed aift form to:

Be sure to write the name of your gift designation "EXACT NAME OF DEPARTMENT or FUND" in the memo area of the check.
