

The UMBC Louis Stokes Alliance for Minority Participation (LSAMP) invites undergraduate scholars to enhance their summer research experience through an immersive, faculty-mentored program. Selected students will join a community of researchers, participate in professional development, and receive up to \$3,500 in financial support. Open to STEM students conducting research over eight weeks, this opportunity prioritizes those historically underrepresented in STEM. Scholars will engage in structured programming, submit research reflections, and present their findings at prestigious conferences. Applications are due by Monday, March 31st, 2025—seize this chance to advance your research journey with distinction.



CoLab 2025 is a paid, in-person summer internship for UMBC undergraduates, offering hands-on experience in narrative-based research and interdisciplinary collaboration. **Open to all majors**, it helps STEM students strengthen storytelling skills and humanities/social science students gain research and technical expertise. Interns will work on projects supporting community organizations and scholars while earning a **\$3,000 stipend and a tuition scholarship** for a 3-credit course. The program runs June 2 – June 27, 2025, meeting on-campus, Monday–Friday, 9:30 AM – 4:00 PM, with preparatory work required before the start and a final paper due after.
