Jim Burger

A graduate of the Maryland Institute College of Art in 1982, Burger went on to hone his trade at the Baltimore City Paper and the Baltimore Sun. In addition to his photography, Burger also worked as a writer for local publications, and collaborated on many books, including a book on the Baltimore City Fire Department; "...In Service." He also partnered with Baltimore Sun food writer, Rob Kasper, and Baltimore Orioles legendary first baseman, Boog Powell, to publish "Baltimore Beer: A Satisfying History of Charm City Brewing," and "Baltimore Baseball and Barbeque with Boog Powell." He was a commissioned photographer for "America 24/7: 24 Hours. 7 Days. Extraordinary Images of One American Week." Upon release in 2003, the book shot to #1 on the New York Times Best Sellers List. The artist is also a three-time recipient of the Maryland State Arts Council Individual Artist Grant.
