



## **Returning Women Students Scholarship Common Application Instructions**

The goal of the Returning Women Students Scholarship is to support undergraduate students age 25 and older in the completion of their first bachelor's degree. In addition to financial support offered through four different scholarships, the Returning Women Students Scholarships Program provides a scholars community and various other support services and resources for scholarship recipients.

Before completing the 2019-2020 academic year scholarship application, review the scholarship criteria that are common for all four scholarships. Please note the specific criteria required for each individual scholarship and include the additional information as necessary in your application. The boxes below are intended to serve as a checklist for you prior to submitting your application packet. Keep this information page for your records.

We highly encourage applicants to attend an information session before submitting their application.

### APPLICATION DEADLINE DATE: MONDAY, APRIL 1, 2019

El	igibility Requirements for All Scholarships:
	Must be a UMBC student, 25 years or older, pursuing a first bachelor's degree
	Must have completed at least 60 credits
	Must be in good academic standing and have a GPA of at least 2.5
	Must be enrolled or planning to enroll part-time or full-time at UMBC during the academic year
	Must complete an online Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at <a href="www.fafsa.ed.gov">www.fafsa.ed.gov</a> . UMBC's FAFSA code is: 002105
	Must include an unofficial transcript. See details in "required attachments" section below
	The essay portion of the application <u>must</u> be typed and satisfy all eligibility requirements to be considered
	Please note: Scholarships are only available for the fall and spring semesters and not for summer or winter.

Cł	narlotte W. Newcombe Scholarship & The UMBC Scholarship for Mature Students:
	Must show financial need
	Must explain extenuating life situations that create additional financial support in their essay
	Must clearly identify their educational and career goals in their essay  This is the signature scholarship for the Women's Center's Returning Women Students Scholarship Program and each year a cohort of approximately 12-15 Newcombe scholars are selected. Award amounts vary anywhere between \$1,000-\$4,000 based on individual need and merit.
Al	EGON Scholarship:
	Must show financial need
	Must have financial dependents and be able to demonstrate family responsibilities in their essay Award amounts can vary anywhere between \$1,000-\$3,000 for the academic year; 2-4 students are awarded.
Th	ne Richard & Roselyn Bryson Neville Memorial Fund for Returning Women Scholarship:
	Must be U.S. citizen Award amount is typically between \$1,000-\$1,500 for the academic year; 1 student is awarded.
Th	ne Rosalie Tydings Business and Professional Women's Scholarship:
	Must be U.S. citizen  Award amount is typically around \$1,000 for the academic year; 1 student is awarded.

<u> </u>	EQUIRED ATTACHMENTS for All Scholarship Applications:
	Most recent college transcript (unofficial transcripts are acceptable). If you are a recent transfer to UMBC and have no UMBC grades, please also include a transcript from your former institution.
	A brief essay that addresses why you chose to return to school, what you are studying and your goals related to your education, and your intended career/educational goal(s) after graduation. (700 words maximum)*
	A brief essay identifying any barriers or challenges that you have faced or are facing in pursuing your degree and description of how admission into the Returning Women Students Scholarship Program will help you in overcoming these barriers or challenges. (350 words maximum)*
	*You may combine item 2 and item 3 into one essay if preferred.
	(OPTIONAL ATTACHMENT) If you are applying to the Newcombe or AEGON scholarships and are experiencing unusual personal or family hardship that would not be highlighted in your FAFSA application or has <u>not</u> otherwise been documented through this application process, you may also include a brief summary of that information with your application. Please be prepared to provide documentation to support your statement (e.g. medical bills, childcare expenses, etc.) <u>if requested</u> by the scholarship committee. (250 words maximum)

<u>Please note:</u> If you choose to include any details related to sexual violence or childhood sexual abuse in your essays, the scholarship committee is obligated to follow University and USM protocol. ☐ **Do not staple** application materials. Electronic applications must be submitted as **1 complete PDF** document.

### **Scholars Program Requirements for All Scholarship Awardees:**

- 1. If selected as a scholarship recipient, you will be required to sign the Women's Center Scholarship Agreement Form and any other additional forms required by the Office of Financial Aid and Scholarship before receiving the award.
- 2. Awardees must also comply with the Returning Women Student Scholars Program requirements outlined in the Women's Center Scholarship Agreement Form. The requirements can also be found at <a href="https://www.womenscenter.umbc.edu/scholarships">womenscenter.umbc.edu/scholarships</a>. Please review requirements before submitting your application.

Failure to honor these requirements may result in forfeiture of the award.
